In order to proceed, we need to know how many wants or can take this journey of a weekday reunion with us. I know that for us that are no longer working, half the time we don't even know what day of the week it is, unless we look at a calendar. So, we are taking a **non-binding** survey to find out how many people would be interested or available for a weekday reunion, as opposed to the historic weekend reunion. Without this information, we will be in the untenable position of guessing. Trust me when I say that in negotiating these and other contracts for many years, I would not put myself in that position. If we are to proceed, the primary reunion days will be on a Tuesday and Wednesday with a negotiated mandate that whichever hotel is selected, they also honor our negotiated rates for Monday and Thursday. We have been looking at dates in early May or late June.

Until we have this information, albeit unofficial, we will not be able to know what our approximate numbers are and needless to say that would severely restrict our ability to negotiate the best deal possible for you. We want to provide you with a reunion better than any we have held before and at a cost that is feasible.
