

Also in my envelope were about 16 letters from family and friends. Every one of those letters brought me to tears.

Upon arrival in Tampa, we got off the plane and as we were leaving this section of the airport we were in single file and the President of the Honor Flight shook our hand and thanked us for going and asked if we enjoyed the trip, and wished us a good night and pointed to the direction to leave the airport. As we made the turn to leave that part of the airport, we were greeted by Honor Guards from 3 local police departments, Coast Guard, and Various Veteran organizations standing at attention and saluting us.
